Our School Swimming Program commences this Friday 14th August at the Orange Aquatic Centre.

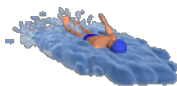

Touch Football

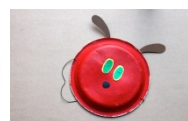
Touch Football Gala Day will be held this Wednesday 12 August at Anzac Park.

Campaign to 'Save our voices'
