Volunteers

Thank you to those families who have volunteered over the last few weeks for jobs big and small. Your efforts are truly appreciated and it makes our school a better place for the students. We are more than happy for families to contribute in any way possible to help out your child's school.

We are currently looking for volunteers to help run a literacy support program for the first 20 minutes on any morning of the week that suits. The program is called 'Multilit' and is easy to administer with minimal training. Mrs Barrett will

provide the required training next Monday morning from 9:15am to 10:15am.

Even if your child doesn't require this support by assisting us with this it will allow the staff to provide support and extension programs to other students. If you can help out, it would be much appreciated.

Garden and Cooking Links with the Curriculum

The Stephanie Alexander Cooking and Gardening program will be running in Terms 1 and 4 this year. The program offers rich and varied links with the general curriculum – literacy, numeracy, science, and art design. Students write reports, paint pictures of the garden, investigate preserving foods, learn the names of plants and dishes in several languages and learn hands-on real world measurement skills. The program enhances knowledge for all types of learning and is particularly valuable for children who struggle with an academic classroom program.



ACER Testing and Parent Teacher Interviews

Last week students from Year 2 to Year 6 participated in Literacy and Numeracy testing as part of an Orange District Department of Education initiative. The standardised testing was all online and was marked and graphed by ACER. We will use this information along with our already vast knowledge of our students to guide our literacy and numeracy teaching and assist with individualised programming. In the last week of

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term, we will hold parent teacher interviews where we would like to discuss your child's progress so far this year, the goals we have set for them over the coming terms and how we will help them achieve these goals.
