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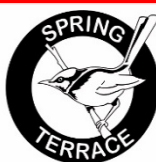

Term 4 Sport - Swimming

Swimming continues this Wednesday.

Students need to come prepared with:

- Swimmers
- Towel
- Goggles
- Plastic bag for wet swimmers/towels
- Hair band if necessary

The cost will be \$5 per student per week. This can be paid weekly or as a single payment of \$50.00. Please speak to Mr Scott if you need assistance in paying for swimming.

Note: *Please clearly label clothing/personal items.*

Swimming Organisation

Travel and times - travel to town by Cook's Service leaving school at 2pm. Swimming lessons commence at 2:30pm and go until 3:15 followed by 10 minutes of free time under teacher supervision. Parents need to be at the pool at **3:30 pm** and have their child's name marked off before taking them.

Safety - student safety in and around the pool is our primary concern.

Staff - will be vigilant and know where the students in their group are at all times.

Parents - will need to come to the grandstand end of the indoor pool to collect their children and have their names marked off.

Students - are required to listen to their teacher/instructor and follow instructions. If students disobey instructions, break school or Orange Aquatic Centre rules they may have to sit out.

Groups - Miss Toovey and Miss Hutchison will take the beginning swimmers. The aim of this group is to become confident in the water, be able to float and get to the edge if they fall in as well as learning to float and swim.

Swimming instructors from the aquatic centre will take the middle three groups. These three groups will practise the above, as well as improving their freestyle and learning other strokes.

Mr Scott will take the students who can swim 25 metres. This group will practise all of the above as well as working on the distance and speed they can swim all strokes.

Miss Paige will be on the deck and will look after any students who need to leave the water. Miss Paige will usually have the roll, please have your child's name marked off before you take them.
