2020 Class Organisation

As you'll know this year we will have three classes in 2020. Miss Hutchison will have ten students from Kindergarten and Year 1, Miss Toovey will have ten students from Years 1 and 2 while Mr Scott will have sixteen students in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6. These will be the students "Home classes." For Spelling and Mathematics students will be split into ability groups and for Science with Mr Scott, Art with Miss Hutchison and Japanese with Miss Toovey students will be split into two groups. The staff have spent considerable time weighing up how we can use our resources as effectively as possible to ensure each child gets the education and positive school experience that they deserve.

Best Start-Kindergarten

Tomorrow, Thursday, Miss Hutchison will complete the Best Start Assessment with each of the Kindergarten students. Best Start lets us know where students are starting when they first arrive at school. Teachers can use this information to plan the most effective program for the students and measure student growth throughout the year. Parents will receive a report that identifies what the next steps are for their child.
