COVID Update

School-Home Communication & Newsletter Survey

Thank you to those who completed the survey via the P&C Facebook page link, the results have been included on the last page of today's newsletter. Findings from the survey concluded:

- 1. Almost everybody reads the paper copy of the newsletter that comes home each Tuesday but about 30% would happily opt out of a paper copy and access it in a digital form.
- 2. The majority are happy with the current format of the newsletter.
- 3. 30% of respondents felt that we could communicate school events and information in a clearer and timelier manner.

- 3. Printing in black and white to save money.

Resulting actions will include;

K/1 Classroom

K/1 students are continuing their 'Where the Wild things are' unit. In Mathematics, students are looking at multiplication.

1/2 Classroom

PAX Good Behaviour Game - FOCUS

This week's PAX GBG focus:

- 1. **Beat the Timer-** Beat the timer is a strategy that reduces the amount of time to complete a task. In turn, Beat the Timer decreases the dawdling, trouble-making and procrastination that can occur between activities or during transitions. It increases engagement in activities.
- 2. **PAX Stix-** PAX Stix help create a nurturing environment by promoting trust and predictability between the teacher and students, and among the students themselves.
