Messages from the Principal		

Welcome to Term 4

It was very exciting to welcome back all students this morning along with Miss Toovey and a new family, the Hirst's. Winston is in Year 3 and Lincoln is in Year 1. We are pleased to have everybody back in the classroom and some sort of normality to return.

Term 4 will be a little different to a regular term 4, as rather than winding down as we head towards the end of the year, we will be working to ensure we make the most of every learning opportunity for every student. Parents can assist us in this by making certain that students attend school as regularly as possible. COVID restrictions mean that our plans to run activities such as swimming and our end of year Presentation Night are currently up in the air. If conditions are eased, we will do our best to run these activities in some form while giving families information in a timely manner.

End of school day - pick up time

We will return to the regular pick up time of 3.15pm for all students. Please stay in your car and a staff member will bring students out to you.

Level 3 COVID operations

We are currently operating under Level 3 School Operations. In summary:

- All students are expected to be at school every day.
- If students have even the mildest of COVID-19 symptoms, they must stay home.
- Non-essential visitors cannot enter the school grounds. Please ring the office or me if there is nobody at the gate.
- Under the current health orders, students and staff should reduce travelling to areas with higher levels
 of COVID-19 restrictions in place but can still attend school if they do.

A reminder for all families

Students must not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. Any person with any COVID-19 symptoms must remain at home and not return to school unless:

- they have isolated for 10 days, when no medical certificate is available
- they have a negative COVID-19 test result and are symptom free.

In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms, a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.

Anyone who is unwell with COVID-19 symptoms is strongly encouraged to get tested and self-isolate until a negative result is received.

Visitors

Non-essential visitors are not permitted in schools. Some visitors are permitted in schools based on the guidelines that follow.

Parents should:

maintain physical distancing by avoiding gathering outside of school gates



- remain outside of school grounds
- follow mask-wearing requirements and sign in using Service NSW QR code if permitted to enter school

Sporting Schools - Swimming Program

This term we have funding from Sporting Schools for a swimming program. The current COVID operational guidelines don't permit us to travel for sport or excursions however as soon as restrictions are eased, we will start our Wednesday afternoon lessons at the Orange Aquatic Centre. Attached to this newsletter are further details and a permission note. Please return this note and money no later than next Wednesday so that we are ready to start lessons as soon as we are given the go-ahead.

Class and School Organisation

With Miss Toovey's return we are back to running three classes full time. We have Mrs Napier working Tuesdays and Thursdays, running support programs for students and relieving teachers when they are completing training and working with individuals and small groups of students. Miss Bri will continue to support teachers and students Mon to Fri and Jameson will do the same each Monday and Wednesday.

New Home Readers - Thanks to CSU Community Grant

The P&C was granted \$1000 from Charles Sturt University as part of its Community Grants program. This money has gone towards the 100 Home Reader Club and has been used to purchase 178 new home readers. Families may shortly start seeing these books coming home, to be read and returned, as part of the Home Reading program.



Spending time each day, having your child read to you, is one of the best things you can do to help them learn to read. All it takes is around 10 minutes of effort by the child, and then don't forget to sign off the record book.

When students achieve 100 nights of home reading, they are eligible to receive a \$25 book voucher to Collins Bookstore. This is being funded in partnership by the P&C and the school, and we hope it helps motivate your kids to keep reading! Thank you to Charles Sturt University for this grant!

Don't forget the open garden this Sunday 10-12pm, it's planting our seedlings day! Have a great week!
