NAIDOC WEEK



The theme for this year's NAIDOC Week celebrations is 'HEAL COUNTRY' and commences on Saturday 29 October and runs through to Saturday 6 November. NAIDOC Week celebrates the history, culture, and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC is celebrated not only in Indigenous communities, but by Australians from all walks of life. The week is a great opportunity to participate in activities and to support our local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community. Unfortunately, due to COVID restrictions the major public event had to be cancelled.

COVID restrictions and Department regulations

As you are probably aware two schools have had to close due to positive COVID cases in the last week. As well as students not attending school they have gone through deep cleaning and contact tracing. We don't want our students at risk of catching COVID or missing any more school than they absolutely must.

Kinder 2022 Orientation

If you have a child who is five or turning five before 1 July 2022 and who will be enrolling at Spring Terrace next year. Kinder Orientation starts next week. If you haven't already notified the office, please do so as soon as possible so we can provide you with a letter outlining the program and what is required.

Presentation Night/Year 6 Graduation

It appears that we will be able to hold a presentation night in some form after 1 December, as long as it fits within some tight guidelines. This will be held the last week of term on Tuesday 14 December. Further information will be made available closer to the date. All visitors will have to be fully vaccinated and wear a mask to attend, and we must socially distance. There will also be some limitations on performances, for example no singing.



Enrolments for 2022

We currently have 45 enrolments for 2022 as well as 3 young pre-schoolers who could enrol, 1 student returning and 1 interested in moving to STPS, that's 50 for the opportunity to have another teacher. We would need 52 students as a minimum.

While we will certainly continue to provide an excellent education for all students with the staffing we have, adding another teacher would be a great advantage to our school.

Spring Into School enrolment enquires for 2022 are welcome for children who are **fully toilet trained** and aged from 3 to 5 years who will be starting school at STPS, as well as children living in the area whose parents may or may not be intending to send them to STPS.

If you know of any families considering moving to the area or have shown an interest in STPS, please encourage them to make an appointment to meet with staff and/or request an information pack so they have the information they need to make the decision that is right for their child/ren.

Before and After School Care

[']Big Childcare' are getting set up at school ready to commence operations. We are waiting on final confirmation of a start date. If you would like an enrolment pack, please phone the office. Care will be available from 7am in the morning until school starts and again from end of school until 6 pm in the evening. Water Bottles

Please ensure all children bring a water bottle to school each day. Many students are coming to school without one and it is important they can stay well hydrated during the day. This is especially important now the weather is warming up and they are more active in the playground. Drinking water keeps they body functioning properly by:

- Carrying nutrients and oxygen to your cells
- Flushing bacteria from your bladder
- Aiding digestion

Preventing constipation

- Normalising blood pressure and stabilising the heart
- Cushioning joints and protecting organs and tissue
- Regulating body temperature
- Maintaining electrolyte (sodium) balance

Being SunSmart and SunSafe

Although we're still experiencing some cooler weather, ultraviolet (UV) radiation will reach levels high enough to damage our skin. In fact, in NSW, UV levels are high enough to cause damage to unprotected skin for most months of the year. Remember, sun damage is caused by UV radiation not heat. You can't see or feel UV.

A windy, cool, or cloudy day can have similar UV levels to a warm, sunny day. Children must always wear their hats outside.

<u>School Banking</u>

Several state and territory governments have announced bans on banks delivering programs in schools, and the NSW Government announced a similar decision, because of a report from the Australian Securities and Investments Commission (ASIC) review and these government decisions, the Commonwealth Bank will no longer be providing programs in schools.
