#### **COVID Term 4 roadmap for schools**

The following guidelines, designed to keep students and staff safe while allowing for effective teaching and learning will be in place for the remainder of the term. From 8 November, we are operating on updated Level 3 guidelines, with additional activities allowed in a COVID-safe manner.

Messages from the Principal

- Do not attend school or participate in any school activities if unwell, even with mild symptoms. Get tested and remain home until well and can provide a negative test result before returning to school.
- All staff and adult visitors to school sites must be fully vaccinated.
- Masks are required indoors.
- All staff and approved visitors must check in when attending a school site or gathering.
- Schools must maintain attendance records of all gatherings.

Fully vaccinated parents and carers will now be allowed on site to support curriculum delivery, student wellbeing activities and school operations (for example reading support, canteen, and uniform shops). Parents and carers must check in using the school check-in and show proof of vaccination on entry to the school site.

Assemblies and presentations will be allowed outdoors on site. Fully vaccinated visitors (including parents and carers) are only allowed to attend if completing a specific role (such as presenting) and at the invitation of the school. All visitors must check in using the school check-in and show proof of vaccination.

Community use will be allowed outside of school hours, per general community settings and with a COVID19 Safety Plan, including any specific plans required under Public Health Orders. This includes P&C meetings.

Other visitors may request the school's permission to come on site to conduct relevant work duties. These decisions are at the discretion of the school. All visitors must sign in using the school check-in app and show proof of vaccination status on entry to the school site.

Please continue to phone ahead and meet staff at the gate to ensure we abide by these guidelines and maintain a COVID free learning environment.



#### Before and After School Care -Big Childcare

#### Remembrance Day

This Thursday, 11 November our students will participate in a Remembrance Day ceremony at school to pay respect and pause for one minute to remember the service and sacrifice of our veterans and current serving personnel who have been affected by war.



#### **Presentation Day/Night**

We recently set the date of 14 December for a presentation ceremony in the hope that restrictions would be relaxed enough by then to hold a ceremony like last years. While restrictions have eased, we are still not able to have an open invite event. Parents and carers only will be invited to attend a presentation assembly to be held at school from 2.00 pm. Parents will present their child/children with their 2021 Certificate of Achievement at this assembly.

In the evening of Tuesday 14 December, we will hold a farewell dinner at school for our Year 6 students and their families. Year 5 students will be invited to attend and assist in running the evening.

#### K/1 Classroom

This Week in K/1 we are learning about sharing in Mathematics, we are looking how to share out things equally and the year one students will be looking at some division problems.

#### Year 2 Classroom

This week is our revision week, students will be revising previous taught topics in Mathematics. Year 2 students have begun to publish their autobiographies. Thank you to all, who have sent me or sent in photos for your child's autobiography. Students are loving this unit!

Students are learning about the importance of Remembrance Day and have created poppies for Thursday's Remembrance Day Ceremony. Tomorrow, Year 2 students are excited to attend a virtual excursion titled What does Remembrance Day mean? hosted by The Australian War Memorial.

Last week K-2 students learned how to draw a triceratops. Today our K-2 Palaeontologists attended virtual excursion called *Life on Earth* presented by The Australian Environmental Education. Students learned about fossils and how they are made, looked at the geological time scale, explored fossil sites across Australia and looked at mass extinction of the dinosaurs. Our K-2 Palaeontologists are looking forward to making their own fossils next week.

#### 3-6 Classroom

This week the primary class is continuing to use Google Sites to make websites. The students are practicing using emotive language to make their holiday destination appealing to prospective guests.

While all students will be learning about the importance of Remembrance Day the Year 5 and 6 students will be organising and running a Remembrance Day service on Thursday morning.
