Summer is coming so be SunSmart

As we head into summer this week, although we're still experiencing some very wet and cold weather, ultraviolet (UV) radiation will reach levels high enough to damage our skin. In fact, in NSW, UV levels are high enough to cause damage to unprotected skin for most months of the year. Remember, sun damage is caused by UV radiation not heat. You can't see or feel UV. A windy, cool, or cloudy day can have similar UV levels to a warm, sunny day. The simplest way to reduce your risk of skin cancer is to use sun protection when the UV index is 3 or above. Wanted: People to be a part of a Sheep Squad!

The P&C are exploring the idea of running around 5 ewes (shedding types like Dorper or Australian White) on the spare land that the school owns. This will have several benefits:

- Fundraising income around \$1000/year
- > Opportunities for students to learn about sheep and their management
- > Keeping the grass short enough in the bike area for the students to use the bikes
- Cute lambs at school!

It is proposed that a small number of families/people (maybe 4) become the Sheep Squad, and will be responsible for the project and become a sub-committee of the P&C. Once we are set up this would involve:

- Monitoring and moving the sheep between the two parcels of land, at either end of the school as required.
- Checking the fence lines and water supply
- Drenching the sheep once or twice a year
- Marking lambs once a year
- Transporting a ram to school for a 3-month spell and then out again
- Transporting the lambs to Carcoar for sale once a year

We are keen to hear from anyone who may be interested in being a part of the Sheep Squad. No experience with sheep is required as this project provides an opportunity to gain some skills working alongside other families who are competent in sheep handling.
