Welcome Back

Welcome to the 2021 school year at Spring Terrace. A special welcome to the new families that have joined us this year, I'm sure your family will enjoy being part of the Spring Terrace community.

We total 43 students this year, with only slight changes to our class structure. Miss Hutchison will have kindergarten and year 1 with 12 students, Mr Edwards will have year 2 with 13 students until week 7 when Miss Toovey returns and I (Mr Scott) will take years 3 to 6 with 18 students.

This year we will continue to consolidate strategies put in place in 2020 and will look for new ways to improve our practices to ensure that every child has the opportunity to learn to the best of their ability.

As always, our teachers invite parents to talk to them about their child's progress and how we can best work together to facilitate learning. If, at any time, you wish to speak to a staff member please don't hesitate to arrange a suitable time to meet.

Entering/Signing on to School Premises

We now have a Service NSW COVID safe QR code in the school foyer but please note this **does not** replace the need to sign-in using the school's visitor logbook. This is required as the department cannot access dates from the COVID safe Check-in app and records of school visitors are required to support emergency procedures.

OSSA Swimming Carnival

This Friday Millie, Tessa, Tess and Sammy will represent Spring Terrace at the OSSA Swimming carnival, I'm sure they will represent their school with pride and do their very best. I will be attending the carnival to help with its organisation and running.

The students in years 3 to 6 who are not attending the carnival will be split between Miss Hutchison's and Mr Edward's classes.

Best Start

On Monday our Kindergarten students completed the Best Start Assessment. This is a one on one assessment completed by all NSW Public School kindergarten students. The assessment gives the teacher a clear picture of what students come to school with and allows them to tailor learning activities accordingly. Parents of kindergarten students will receive a report on the outcomes of this assessment in coming days and are welcome to discuss these results with Miss Hutchison or Mr Scott.

Homework

Homework for all classes will start in week 4 (this is week 2) as we are currently updating our homework policy and want to have the draft in place before homework begins.

Once the draft homework policy is complete it will be sent home for parents to review and comment on before it is finalised.

Timetable Changes

As was mentioned last year we are trialling a change to our timetable for term 1. We are looking for the combination of class and break times that aligns best with students' ability to stay focussed and learn to their
