#### K/1 Classroom

A big thank you to the students who returned their homework on Friday. Homework will be sent out today with two new home readers for the children to read. If your child wishes to read a book from home, it is encouraged also. Please make sure that the home reader booklet is filled out each night. In mathematics, we are looking at our Friends of 10 and Friends of 20 and using addition strategies in association with this. We are looking at 'Time' and different ways in which time is measured. # Year 2 Classroom

What came first? The chicken or the egg...?? We have begun looking at all things chicken and all things egg. Not only will this allow us to learn and discover about our feathered friends and be able to interpret non-fiction texts; but will assist us in being able to use facts when producing some informative writing pieces of our own. Elsewhere, we will be focusing on time, the history of technology and some athletics carnival practice around our regular activities.

#### 3-6 Classroom

The primary class are continuing to practice their story writing this week. Students have been learning about how authors plan before they write and the elements that go into making a great story. In mathematics we are continuing to learn about whole number. Year 3 are learning about how to read and write numbers up to hundred thousands, through to year 6 who are learning to read and write large numbers and work with negative numbers. In Science we are investigating the properties of materials.
