## **COVID-19 Public Health Orders**

The NSW Health Minister has made the Public Health (COVID-19 Self-Isolation) Order 2022, which commenced at 5pm Monday 5 March 2022. The Order revokes and remakes the current Public Health (COVID-19 Self-Isolation) Order (No 4) 2021, with amendments.

#### **Diagnosed cases**

The Order requires persons diagnosed with COVID-19 to self-isolate until "medically cleared". Medical clearance occurs 7 days after the person undertook their test or a lesser time notified by NSW Health or a medical practitioner.

A diagnosed person must notify certain persons of their positive result, including household members and their employer or in our case the school. If the person tested positive via a rapid antigen test, the person must also notify Service NSW. If a diagnosed case is given a medical clearance notice, the person is taken to have complied with any requirements to be vaccinated under another public health order for six weeks.

#### **Close and household contacts**

Certain contacts of a diagnosed case are also required to self-isolate:

A close contact notified by an authorized contact tracer must self-isolate for 7 days, a household contact must self-isolate for 7 days commencing from when the diagnosed person took the test (note, in practice this could end up being less than 7 days if the diagnosed person took a PCR test and it took a couple of days to get a positive result).

This is a change from the current order where the 7 days is counted from the time the person was last in contact with the diagnosed case. Further, the household contact is not obligated to self-isolate as a contact if they are subsequently notified by another household contact and it has been no more than 14 days since the contact completed their self-isolation period, and a close contact or household contact is not required to self-isolate as a contact if the person previously had COVID-19 and it has been less than 8 weeks since the person ceased self-isolating as a case.

## Rapid Antigen Test Kits

Packs were distributed to students this week as a departmental requirement for monitoring of symptoms. Please contact the school if you have any concerns regarding the above information.

## Head Lice

We have had incidences of Head Lice in the school. Please check your child's hair and monitor for infestations and treat accordingly. This is a highly contagious and transmissible condition. Information on treatment methods are available from:

## News from the classrooms

#### K/1 Classroom with Miss Hutchison

This week in K/1 we are focusing on our writing skills. Kindergarten will be doing the correct letter formation as well as learning the conventions of a sentence. Year 1 are going to be learning punctuation and how it is used correctly in a sentence.

In Maths, we are learning about time, day/night, the duration of time and for Year 1 telling the time on the hour and half hour.

A massive congratulations to all children in K/1 as we have 100% in the return of homework. A reminder to parents to keep practicing sight words as children are tested on them each week.



Have a wonderful week as we reach the half way point in term 1.

#### Year 2/3 Classroom with Mrs Lloyd and Mrs Lee

Wow the term is going so fast, I cannot believe we are in Week 7 already. 2/3 have been learning how to write an orientation to an imaginative text using 'Possum Magic' as a model.

In Maths, Year 2 have been learning about number facts-equivalence and how to balance their sums, while Year 3 have been focusing on measurement using metres and centimetres. This week Year 2 will be looking at time on the hour and half past and Year 3 will be examining fractions including halves and quarters.

Students have been learning about Gratitude, Empathy and Mindfulness with Mrs Lee using the new program "The Resilience Project".

Great work on the homework everyone! Keep up the home reading! Have a fantastic week! Years 3/4/5/& 6 with Mr Edwards

A quick round-up of current learning in our classroom if your children are anything like mine and 'can't remember' what they did at school...! We are spelling in the morning using strategies, themes and patterns to learn tricky words and/or sound/letter combinations. Meanwhile we are starting to learn ways to talk, write and think persuasively during English time.

Years 4-6 are learning and re-visiting fractions, decimals, and terms like equivalent, whole and parts during Mathematics.

When Mrs Lloyd's Year 3 group joins us for our other Key Learning Areas, we are currently discovering relationships between animals in science including life cycles and food chains, comparing periods of 'First Contact' in History (both Aboriginal and European).

We are considering physical, mental, and personal safety situations in PDH, and elements of 'sprint' and 'jump' during PE.

In Music with Mrs Denham we are learning about percussion, beat and writing/reading sheet Music on Fridays. Another busy week, enjoy!
