Parent Teacher Interviews

Bookings are to be made from Thursday onwards, by contacting the School Office on 6365 4287 Interviews are scheduled from 3.30 pm until 6.20 pm. These will be allocated on a first in first served basis.

If you require more time to discuss your child's progress, please make an alternative time to meet with the class teacher at the time of the interview. Parents of students requiring a Personalised Learning and

Support Plan (previously called and IEP) will be contacted in the coming weeks to arrange an alternate time to discuss these plans. You do not need to book a 10 minute interview time for Monday 28 March.

Check in Assessment

Students in Years 4 and 6 will be participating in the Check in Assessment during Week 10 this term. It is an online assessment that will gage how they are performing and provide information to staff on 'where to take them next' based on their responses. These tests provide valuable information that enables teachers to specifically target and differentiate lessons to meet student needs. If you would like to know more about these tests, please speak with Mr Edwards who is coordinating this within our school.

<u>NAPLAN</u>

NAPLAN assessment for our Years 3 and 5 students is fast approaching. It will be conducted during Weeks 3 and 4 in Term 2. Parent information about NAPLAN for students in Years 3 and 5 is coming home with this newsletter. Over the coming weeks students will be participating in some training to prepare for this test.

Attendance

We will be focusing on improving our attendance at school over the coming weeks to see if we can improve our percentage to more than 70% of students attending over 90% of the time. To support this initiative, we will be introducing a 100% attendance ticket at Friday's award assemblies for students who have attended every day and on time during the previous week. Students will then enter these tickets into a prize draw at the end of term. Please encourage your child to attend school every day as research shows children learn best when at school.

News from the classrooms

K/1 Classroom with Miss Hutchison

In English, this week the Kindergarten children have begun to write independently which is fantastic to witness. Year One are writing increasingly more each week without assistance and have made excellent progress. It is so great to see all children in K/1 so enthusiastic about completing their written work on their own.

This week in Mathematics we are all learning about subtraction and to understand this concept we have been counting backwards from 10, 20 and 100, which the children thoroughly enjoy. We are looking at the symbols associated with subtraction like the – sign and the = signs. The children are learning number stories and explaining how number problems are solved using different methods.

During History, K-2 are learning about family and where they come from. Please have a discussion with your child/ren about their heritage and where their ancestors originated from as we will be completing worksheets on different countries. Have a wonderful week.

Education

Year 2/3 Classroom with Mrs Lloyd and Mrs Lee

Welcome to Week 8. It is amazing to think we are this far into the term. In writing, students have been working hard to use capital letters and full stops correctly in their sentences. They examined what a question is and how to use a question mark in grammar. Students are beginning to write compound sentences using words like 'and', 'but' and 'so'. They have enjoyed writing their own 'Magical Animal' stories using 'Possum Magic' as inspiration. This week, students will begin looking at persuasive texts and how to use different points of view to persuade the audience.

In Mathematics, Year 2 will be focusing on subtraction to 10 using number lines and the counting back strategy. Year 3 will be learning about number patterns and time - focusing on half and quarter hours, five-minute intervals, analogue and digital times.

In PD Health, K-2 students have been learning how to 'look after themselves' and in Visual Art, Years 3-6 students have been creating pieces of work based on Picasso, and line drawings including creating a Zen tangles piece to celebrate Harmony Day next week.

Well done to everyone who returned their homework and home readers this week! It certainly makes a difference in your spelling test results when you revise your words 😨 Have an amazing week everyone and enjoy the Jack May Cup tomorrow.

Years 3/4/5/& 6 with Mr Edwards

In the Primary classroom we are focusing on persuasive texts, being able to argue both sides of an idea before deciding on our position. We are also listening to other people's persuasive writing and ideas and being able to show our work on slides is a wonderfully visual way to express our ideas!!

During Maths we are starting to get creative, looking at length, measurement, 2D shapes and patterns to become more hands-on in our Maths learning.

Thank you for all the hard work completing homework and practising important things like spelling words, sentence work and Maths work. Homework is an important part of weekly work for older students, getting into the 'routine' of simple work at home before much more challenging assignments in high school. This week we had 15 out of 21 returned and that 'ain't bad', keep it up!!
