<u>Industrial Action tomorrow – Wednesday 4 May</u>

The NSW Teachers Federation has directed its membership to take industrial action in the form of a 24-hour strike on Wednesday 4 May 2022. As a result of the strike, we will not be operating on that day meaning parents and carers will need to make alternative arrangements for care of student/s that day.

The department has been negotiating with the NSW Teachers Federation since October last year to reach an agreement on the new Teachers Award. The department is seeking a resolution for a new 3-year Teachers Award through arbitration in the Industrial Relations Commission in early May. The department is committed to securing the maximum remuneration increase that it can give to teachers. This includes a 2.5% increase in remuneration for all teachers and related employees which was implemented in January this year. Thank you for your support and understanding during this short period of disruption.

Stewart House

Stewart House is a NSW Department of Education initiative that provides educational services to student in Years 2 to 8 from regional areas of NSW and the ACT. During a 12 day stay children are provided with medical treatment as well as emotional support.



The NSW Department of Education provides the facilities and staff to support Stewart House, all other costs associated with a child's stay are met from charitable donations.

National Scholarship program - Youth off the Streets

Every year, over 20 young people from across Australia are awarded Youth Off The Streets scholarships valued at \$6,000 to pursue further education or training. In addition, each recipient receives an individual mentor who provides guidance and support during their scholarship.



Scholarship Program staff assist the recipients with challenges they may face such as budgeting expenses, housing, employment, healthcare, counselling, and other service referrals.

Nominations are invited from any young person in Australia aged 16 to 21 inclusive (as at 20 September 2022) with genuine talent, ability and/or determination in any education or training course, including (but not limited to): academic skills; visual or performing arts; sport; trade skills; and music. Further details about eligibility criteria can be found on our website.

Nominations must be made by the young person themselves; however, assistance in completing the nomination is encouraged and is your opportunity to help a young person follow their dreams.
