Spring Into School

Our students have settled in well to Spring Into School and are enjoying spending time with the other students during play. Invoices for Term 3 Fees were sent home in Week 9 and are due for payment by Friday 29 July to receive the discounted rate. Fees paid after this date will revert to the full day fee or alternatively you can make an appointment with Mrs Lloyd to establish a payment plan.

End of Term 2

We made it to the end of Term 2 and nearly halfway through Winter. Well done everyone and thank you to families for keeping children at home when they have been unwell. Have a safe, healthy, and happy holiday and the Teachers look forward to seeing all the students on Tuesday 19 July.

The Departments advice on COVID-smart measures for winter and the commencement of Term 3 include supplying rapid antigen tests, the continuation of enhanced cleaning and ventilation, alongside the expectation that unwell staff and students do not attend school.

The department will also support schools to apply additional short-term measures where needed as a 'circuit breaker', working with the department's Health, Safety and Staff Wellbeing case management team should local cases increase. These measures could include mask-wearing, deferring indoor events and cohorts learning from home.

Winter sun protection

Winter can be just as harmful especially in the Snow as it is highly reflective. On a sunny day, clean fresh snow can reflect up to 90% of UV radiation. This means that you can be exposed to almost a double dose of UV, directly from the sun and bouncing off snow-covered surfaces.

If you and your family are planning a trip to the snow over the holidays remember to protect your skin and eyes by:

- Using SPF30 or higher broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen.
- Using an SPF50+ Lip Balm for protection.
- Wear goggles or wrap-around sunglasses

Apply sunscreen 20 minutes before going outside and re-apply every two hours. Snow reflects UV radiation, so make sure you apply sunscreen under your chin, beneath the tip of your nose and behind your ears.
