Attendance Reminders

Attached with this newsletter today are letters identifying unexplained days absent for students from the beginning of the year until today. If you receive a reminder, please read it carefully and complete the return slip giving the reason for the absence. Please send it to school as soon as possible so attendance records can be updated. We appreciate your assistance with this matter.

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents and carers ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at and regularly attend school. Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- ❖ Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parent /carer.
