National Day of Mourning

Spring Terrace Public School will be non-operational this Thursday as per Government and Department of Education advice to observe Australia's national day of mourning for Her Majesty The Queen.

The public holiday is timed around the return of the Prime Minister and Governor-General from London after attending the Queen's funeral. Long-established protocol dictates the official day of mourning should fall the day after their return. The public holiday will only be observed to mourn Queen Elizabeth's death and will be a one-off for 2022.



A National Memorial Service will be held at 11.00am in the Great Hall of Australian Parliament House in Canberra. The service will begin with one minute's silence and will be broadcast live on 9News.com.au. School will be operational as normal on Friday, the last day of Term 3.

Sporting Schools - Swimming



Recycle Right Program



Spring Terrace Public School

has registered to be part of the 2022 Planet Ark 'Recycle Right' schools' program. This involves us actively participating in a national program that focuses on educating children about the environmental benefits of recycling and how to recycle correctly.

As part of this action, we plan to run two new recycling initiatives at school that involve our wider community next term:

Lids4Kids

Throughout Term 4 we have volunteered to become a Lids4Kids Community Collection Point. This wonderful national program encourages communities to collect plastic lids that are no longer used, recycling them into new products including prosthetic limbs for children through Envision Hands.

If you would like to donate unwanted plastic lids to this worthy cause you will find a blue plastic bin in our COLA. Pop your lids (see image for those accepted) into the bin and we will deliver them at the end of term for their recycling journey.



Soft Plastics

Whilst many products these days are packaged in soft plastics, it is frustrating that regular council recycling only accepts rigid plastic items. From now on, Spring Terrace Public School will become a Soft Plastic Community Collection Point for you to drop off these unwanted products, so they do not end up in landfill.



Next term our COLA will also feature a Soft Plastic Collection Bin where families are encouraged to drop off unwanted and clean scrunchables! If you have finished with some plastic packaging that can be scrunched up into a ball, please drop it off in our bin. This will also be recycled into new and valuable products. You might be interested to know that all major supermarkets also collect soft plastics – you can find these bins in Coles, Woollies, Aldi & IGA in Orange and Blayney too! or have a look at https://www.cleanup.org.au/softplasticsrecycling
