COIVD positive cases

As advised by letter sent home yesterday, the school has been notified of positive COVID cases within our school community. If any student has symptoms they must RAT test and not attend school until symptoms have cleared or are confirmed as a positive case. In the instance of a positive household case, please be advised that siblings may attend school if they are symptom free and conduct RAT test each morning returning a negative result for 5 days. They must wear a mask indoors while at school except when eating or drinking.

All positive cases must be reported to the NSW Health line at the <u>Service NSW website</u> or <u>Service NSW app</u> so that you can be linked to important health care support and advice. Parents and carers are reminded to please ensure that you select your school name when prompted when registering a positive test for your child.

If children have COVID they are not expected to do school work while isolating. Students who are close contacts and isolating can access the department website learning from home if they wish to do some activities through this link https://education.nsw.gov.au/teaching-and-learning/learning-from-home/learning-at-home/2022-digital-learning-packs Teachers will not be providing additional work to students.

News from the classrooms

K/1 Classroom with Miss Hutchison

K/1 will be focussing on the letters of the alphabet and the sounds that they make. This is an important skill as it allows the children to use this knowledge to start reading unknown words. Please ensure that you still revise the Jolly Phonics sounds with your child daily. Your Jolly Phonics sound mat should be in the children's homework book. If you are unable to find it, please let me know and I will provide you with a new one.

The children have been asked to write sentences using their spelling words. You may write the sentence for your child, and they can copy it onto the sheet. It is important that the children write these sentences, so they are working on their independent writing skills.

In Maths, we are looking at 'Area' and we are comparing the various size of objects.

Library will be starting next Monday so please ensure that your child brings in their library bag clearly labelled with their name. No bag, no borrowing!!

Year 2/3 Classroom with Mrs Lloyd and Mrs Lee

2/3 have been enjoying learning about artifacts in History and last week the students enjoyed bringing in and sharing their artifacts. Felix brought in some interesting coins that used to be part of our currency in earlier times!

This week students will be writing their own stories about doing something for the first time as part of our writing unit 'My Two Blankets'. They enjoyed creating their woven blankets and these are now on display in the foyer at school. If you have time check it out.



In Maths, students will continue their investigation of addition and subtraction strategies by looking at inverse operations, estimates and equivalent numbers.
