Messages from the Principal

Electricity safety week

Electricity Safety Week raises awareness of the hazards associated with electricity and teaches students how to be safe around electricity. Classes will use resources developed in collaboration with the Department of Education to meet the Science and Technology and PDHPE curriculum requirements for years K – 6 to discover and explore safety around electricity and how it is used in our daily lives.

National Child Protection week

In 2022, National Child Protection Week will continue to embrace the overarching message that 'Every child, in every community, needs a fair go'. In particular, this year we will be shining a light on children growing up safe and supported.

Spring Terrace Public School focuses on every child being involved, included and recognised as an individual and is supported to achieve their potential in educational and social settings.

Schools Recognition Week

This week we recognise the contribution of our School Admin Support Staff (SASS) at Spring Terrace Public School. Our SAS Staff play an important role in the school community, they are often the first people you see when entering the school and are essential to maintaining positive relationships with students, parents and the community.



SAS Staff work in school offices, in classrooms and libraries and maintaining and caring for school grounds and buildings. They are often the ones to tend to students when they are unwell and they ensure the efficient management of school financial and administration functions.

Check in Assessments

This week our Year 6 students will participate in the Semester 2 Check-in Assessment. Students in Years 3-5 will complete this task in early Term 4. The Check-in assessment is a NSW Department of Education online literacy and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning.

The assessment supplements existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help Teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to Student needs. All students complete a reading assessment and a numeracy assessment. Year 6 students will also complete a writing task.

Bees Wax Wraps / Waste free Wednesday

Last Friday Birgitte, Cynthia and Julia visited our school to give a workshop on sustainability by making bees wax wraps. The students were reminded about the concepts of Reduce, Reuse and Recycle and had fun making their wraps. We are hoping that they will begin using these instead of soft plastics to wrap up their sandwiches. Mrs Fryda was certainly impressed with how fresh her sandwich remained in her wrap yesterday.

As part of this endeavour Millie and Edith spoke to the school about trialling a 'Waste Free Wednesday' for the remainder of Term 3. (If successful we will bring it in permanently from Term 4).

From tomorrow, we encourage all students to bring their food in reusable containers or in its own skin (nude), to reduce the need for any use of soft plastic.
