

Ideas for stocking fillers in preparation for 2032 return to school

For children starting school or in Years 1 and 2 the following items are some suggestions to help fill Christmas stockings.

Older children in Years 3 - 6 will also need these items with a change to pencils (normal size) and blue, black, red pen once pen license is achieved.

- Magnetic Whiteboard with metal or plastic frame and small whiteboard eraser with a 4 pack of coloured whiteboard markers.
- Triangle pencil in HB and 2B
- Pack of coloured pencils (10 pack is sufficient)
- Pencil sharpener with barrel
- Small Pencil case
- Erasers
- Glue stick 36g Bostick preferred
- 130mm Scissors
- Texta's (10 12 pack is sufficient)
- Ruler
- Highlighters (pack of 4 multi coloured)
- Paint shirt (this can be an old shirt in adult size)
- Library Bag
- Lunch box and water bottle
- Clear case wallet/ document holder (A4) with zip slide or flap (for home readers, homework sheets and notes)
- Iron-on stick-on name labels for clothing and personal items to avoid misplaced items ending up in lost property
