A huge thank you to Mrs Lee, Miss Hutchison and Mrs Fryda for looking after 2/3 in my absence. Whilst it is tricky being away from school, knowing the students are in capable hands makes it so much easier. It was wonderful to see their smiling faces upon my return and to hear about the activities and adventures they had in my absence. It was sad to see the loss of the beautiful trees, but thankfully no one was hurt and no major structural damage occurred.

Homework will recommence this week with our continued focus on learning our times tables and spelling words.

In Maths, students will be revising addition, subtraction, multiplication and division strategies and applying their knowledge to solve number problems.

Whilst in English, students will be learning about how to create interesting 'hooks' to engage their audience when beginning a piece of text.

We will be conducting experiments to examine the properties of force and gravity in Science, and we will look at how Technology has improved people's access to other places in geography.

It is great to see everyone trying their best in the swimming pool. Water safety is so important, and it is wonderful to be able to gain confidence in the water through this wonderful program. Keep up the wonderful effort everyone!

STPS News

Trees

What an interesting time we have had with the storm damage. A second tree went down on Tuesday night causing quite a lot of damage and destruction to garden sheds, fencing and chook house. The chooks survived unscathed and have been temporarily rehomed until the surrounding areas are assessed, repaired or rebuilt.

The dead Pine also had to come down as it was deemed 'too exposed' and presented significant risk. The students were most enthralled with the process by the Arborists on Thursday and watched the felling of the pine tree from a safe distance.

We have retained the wood chip and some tree trunk pieces for the garden to create a learning / yarning space once repatriation of the area has been completed.







Community Garden access

Temporary fencing has been installed around the community garden area to isolate the damage from the trees. Access to the garden is via the gate in the carpark. Please be mindful there is still a lot of work to be done to clean up and repair the damage.

Water to the garden has been isolated due to the damage to the pipes. Hopefully the showers are sufficient to keep the veggies alive until the water can be reconnected.

Mozzies and biting insects

With the continued wet weather, there are a high number of mozzies about and children are getting bitten. Please consider providing them with some form of protection in the morning, particularly now with the number of mosquito borne diseases prevalent in the environment.



Healthy Lunches
