Messages from the Principal

Welcome to 2023

It was with great excitement that staff welcomed our students to Spring Terrace Public School yesterday and we would like to extend a special welcome to our new students and their families. Nine Kinder students-James, Gideon, Kai, Sophie, Saxon, Rose, Sophia, Jack, and Jayden will begin school today. Whilst these students are all very familiar with Spring Terrace, having attended our transition program and orientations last year it is nice to see them all returning officially as students at Spring Terrace. We also welcome Tracey to Year Six and hope you enjoy your year with us and sharing your schooling with your brother, Riley. This year we have 28 families and 46 students attending STPS.

Staff have been busy over the holiday break getting ready for the new academic year and as Acting Principal I feel incredibly lucky to be working with such committed staff and enthusiastic students. I look forward to meeting with you all and working together throughout 2023.

<u>Staffing</u>

This year we have maintained a similar level of staffing to last year with three classes, Mrs Dale Lee has joined the staff on a more permanent basis as the Assistant Principal Curriculum and Instruction, supporting our class teachers to implement the new syllabus and other key learning and assessment programs. Miss Lucy Menzies has joined the staff as classroom teacher providing principal support and release from face to face for Miss Hutchison and Mrs Fryda. Miss Zoe Hutchison will again teach K/1, 2/3 will be taught by Miss Menzies and myself and Mrs Fryda will teach 4-6.

We are fortunate to have Miss Emily, Miss Paige and Mr Jono returning as Student Learning Support Officers (SLSO) assisting in classrooms for literacy and numeracy and learning support for students.

Ms Jenny Symons our Administrative Manager and Mr Danny Davis our General Assistant make up the remainder of the staff at Spring Terrace Public School.

<u>Uniforms</u>

Students are expected to wear the correct uniform every day. Our school uniform provides for students to be active during outdoor play and creates an environment of pride and inclusion. Christine Holmes is the Clothing Pool Coordinator for any enquires regarding ordering new sizes for shirts, polar fleece jumpers or hats. A range of good quality second hand items are also available. Shorts, track pants, socks and shoes are all black and available from retail outlets locally. Please ensure everything is clearly labelled.

Sun Safety

Spring Terrace Public School practices Sun Safety by encouraging students and staff to slip, slop, slap seek and slide. Please talk to your children about being sun safe and apply sunscreen each morning before they leave for school. A 'no hat no play' rule applies to all students.



<u>Library</u>

Miss Emily undertook a stocktake at the end of last year and tracked down students with missing books. We thank parents and carers for assisting with the return of books to the library. If you still have books at home that have not been returned or are considered lost or damaged an invoice will be issued for the replacement cost/s. Students with unreturned books will not be able to borrow until these have been returned or a replacement paid for.

Library lessons for each class will be on Friday each week, so please ensure your child has a library bag for borrowing.

Arrangements to distribute online are being explored, however until further notice, families will continue to receive a paper copy on even weeks, i.e. Weeks 2, 4, 6. 8 and 10. Lunchboxes

After the holiday break it is time to think about packing lunches again. Please ensure your child is able to open their lunch box and containers on their own. Remembering a few simple rules will help your child feel confident and look forward to eating at school.

- Make sure lunchboxes and water bottles are well labelled and your child can identify their own
- Use insulated lunch boxes or cooler bags
- If utensils are required pack these in the lunchbox with foods
- Pack food that is easy to open, easy to eat and not messy
- Include a frozen drink bottle or ice brick to keep food cold in summer
- Avoid using plastic wrap as children find it hard to pull apart. Use re-usable wraps or containers
- Remind your child to wash their hands before eating
- Cut fruit and vegetables into pieces and put them in a small container
- Put dips and yoghurt in a separate container

Friday Lunch orders

Friday lunch orders will commence next Friday, 10 February Parents and Carers are asked to provide individual student lunch orders with order, name and class written on a brown paper bag with the correct money enclosed, (no change will be given) as it makes it too difficult to keep track of money.

All lunch orders are to be handed to Narda Smidt on Thursday morning before first bell. Orders will be delivered on Friday in time for lunch eating.

Building refurbishments

The 2/3 classroom and library have new carpet. This was installed at the end of last year and will certainly make for a more pleasant learning environment and a warmer winter this year.

External wall cladding and internal painting and new carpet in the library and 2/3 classroom have all give our school a freshen up over the holiday break. External painting of the two demountable buildings will continue over the next few weeks.

Term 1 Sport

This term is shaping up to be a very busy one with OSSA carnivals in Swimming, Athletics and Cross Country all happening this term weather permitting before Easter.

Students will be selected to represent the school in Swimming based on their ability to swim the required distances using correct stroke techniques identified at the end of last year during our Learn to Swimming Carnival - Only those students selected to swim will attend the carnival, all other students will remain at school for normal lessons.

All students will participate in the Athletics Carnival with selections for various events happening prior to the day to allow for the smooth running of the carnival on the day. All students will compete in their age race and under 8 years will participate in tabloid sports.

The Cross Country Carnival focuses on students turning 8 years of age this year and above. There are three events of 1 km, 2 km, and 3 km.
