Sentral Parent Portal

The Sentral Parent Portal is ready to go live and will enhance communications between the school and our families. There has been a lot of work occurring behind the scenes to ensure we have up to date and accurate information for all families. Going forward, the Parent Portal will provide access to important information and allows for two way communication between the school and families. The Parent Portal provides the space for:

- news and information
- a school events calendar
- notification and explanation of absences
- publishing of the newsletter electronically (this will still be available on the school website)
- resources such as the Friday lunch order menu and clothing pool price list.

As we progress throughout the year, other information will be added including, excursion and permissions, parent/teacher interview booking, distribution of academic reports etc. Please return the Sentral portal slip to school by Thursday 8 June at the latest, this way we can monitor activity to ensure no-one is missing out on information.

Principals Conference

<u>Attendance</u>

Student attendance is important and as winter approaches and COVID is still lurking in our community we are mindful that students' health and wellbeing is important. It is critical that we continue to practice safe hygiene practices to reduce the risk of cross infection.

Schools Maintenance Contracts are changing

School Infrastructure NSW (SINSW) are moving into a totally new Facilities Maintenance Business from 1st July 2023. SINSW. The Facilities Maintenance Business unit is looking for Local Trades and businesses to come and work directly with them in maintaining the 300 plus public schools across the North Western NSW region.

The North Western NSW Asset Management Unit are partnering with Joss Facility Management in a new way of maintaining schools, designed to streamline maintenance of schools, increase response times for maintenance requests and ease the administrative burden on school staff. It will also actively promote the engagement of Aboriginal people in the maintenance of school facilities and provide better opportunities for local tradespeople.

The new contract ensures they are directly working with local trades and supporting local businesses in our community, driving economic outcomes in local communities by providing better working conditions for local tradespeople, including faster payment terms. The Local Contractors will be working directly for SINSW / North Western AMU. Attached to this newsletter is an information sheet with contact details.
